## *From Pastor Dennis...*

I don't know about you, but I'm patiently waiting for Spring to arrive hoping that it may be here by summer! Summer is a time when our churches in Michigan seem to go into hiatus, at least in terms of program, many committees do not meet, Bible study goes on hold, and in general things wind down as our members vacation and relax. I have grown used to and indeed look forward to the lazy days of summer as a time to vacation, to recreate and sort of recharge. In that spirit, I will be taking a couple of weeks of vacation in June from the 11th to the 28th. While I'm gone Pastor Mich-nay said that he would fill in for me. I won't get a full two weeks in before I and Randy and Cindy Borseson will have to leave for Hazelton, PA for the Slovak Zion Synod Assembly on June 23 through June 25. After returning from the assembly I will finish my vacation time.

Just before leaving on vacation I will lead our church council in retreat to do some training on how to be a DML church council member and perhaps engage in some planning. We owe a debt of thanks to so many people who make things happen around DML, and without their help DML couldn't function. This is especially true of those who serve on church council. We don't have a lot of people at DML but the people whom we do have are good people.

That makes working with them on council or the various boards a pleasure. I know that many organizations claim an 80-20 rule, which means that 20 percent of the people do 80 percent of the work. In the New Testament we also have Mary, the mother of our Lord respond in a similar way when she said, *"Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."* (Luke 1:38 (NRSV)).

There are a couple of upcoming dates I want to mention. Our annual outdoor worship and pig roast is scheduled for August 6th this year. We'll probably continue to use the same format that has proven successful in the past years, considering that the event seems to grow larger each year.

My wife, Lauren, also ad-

vised me to also advise me to advertise my annual bike ride early so people can get it on their calendar. I am planning for the bike ride to happen on September 23rd.

And so, as you relax and vacation and recreate this summer, I would like you to do so in a thankful way, remembering how blessed we are to be able to take vacations. Remember, while you relaxing and playing this summer do not forget to worship. Psalm 100 says, *Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth. <sup>2</sup>Worship the LORD with gladness; come into his presence with singing. <sup>3</sup>Know that the LORD is God. It is he that made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. <sup>4</sup>Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise. Give thanks to him, bless his name. <sup>5</sup>For the LORD is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.* (Psalm 100:1-5 (NRSV))

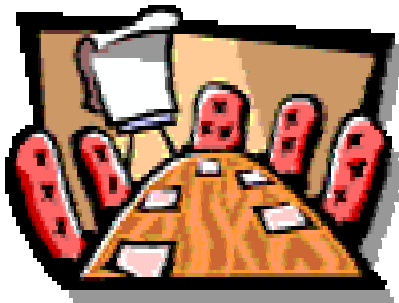

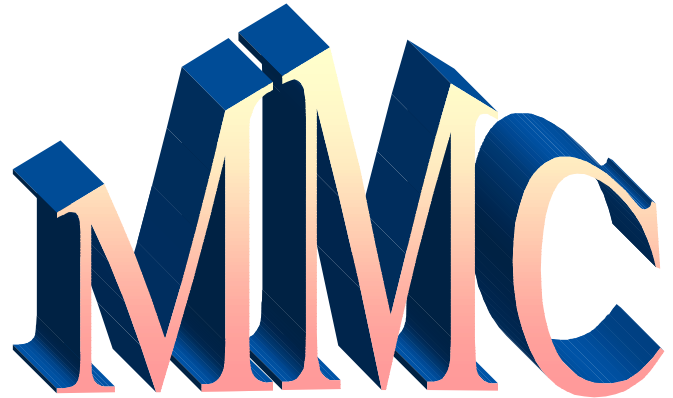

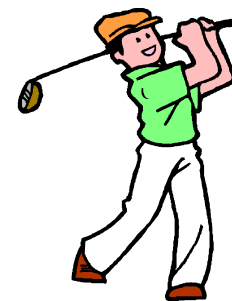

## ***We Say Yes! Stewards of God's mysteries***

*"Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy."* 1 Corinthians 4:1—2

There are at least two ways to read a mystery novel. The quickest way is to skim through the first few pages, find out who was killed and who the suspects are, and then skip immediately to the end to find out who did it. That the quickest way, but it's not the most exciting.

There's another way to read a mystery novel. You settle down into a warm cozy chair, dim the lights, put on your reading glasses, and start at page one. You read every single word, following the twists and turns the writer has intentionally included to keep you guessing. You find yourself enthralled. You can't put

the book down, even though it's way past your bedtime. You read and you read until finally, long after everyone else has gone to bed, you come to the dramatic ending.

Impatient readers might prefer the quicker method. Yet true mystery fans will tell you that the second way is much more fulfilling. Likewise, some people say it doesn't matter how we do things, as long as we get them done. All that matters is the product. He calls us to take up our cross daily, to say "Yes" to God in every moment of our lives. There are no shortcuts in the Christian journey. Yet God walks with us every step of the way.

We are stewards of God's mysteries. Christ is not as concerned about the end product of our lives or all that we accomplish as he is that we be

found trustworthy along the path of our life journey. Following Christ and living as a faithful steward may include a few unexpected turns. Yet we are caught up in Christ's story. We might just be amazed at how fulfilling the whole process can be. Say "Yes" to God's call, become a steward of God's mysteries. God has some wonderful surprises in store for you.

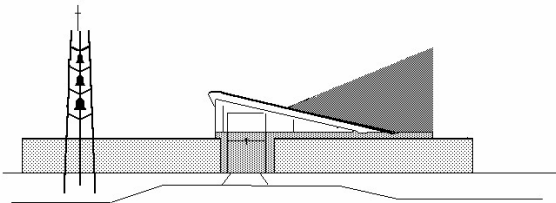
